



## **Prof. dr. Andreas Pyka**

Andreas Pyka is Professor for Innovation Economics at the University of Hohenheim in Stuttgart, Germany. His recent research interests include transformation processes towards a sustainable and climate neutral economy and the role of innovation in the transition process. He is involved in several national and international research projects dealing with the impacts of the bioeconomy, Artificial Intelligence and Robots, and Mobility and Energy Change. His theoretical background is evolutionary and complexity economics. He graduated with a PhD in economics at the University of Augsburg where he also finished his habilitation in 2004. He became professor for economic theory at the University of Bremen in 2006. In 2009 he moved to Stuttgart to start a new chair in innovation economics at the University of Hohenheim. In the last years he was visiting professor at the TU Delft, at the Università degli studi dell'Insubria in Varese and the Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne.
